The New York City Kincare Task Force Resource Directory

The New York City Kincare Task Force was established in 1992 in recognition that the services needed by kincaregivers raising relative children require collaboration among many systems, far beyond the traditional aging or child welfare systems. Our mission is to promote policies and integrated comprehensive services to effectively address the evolving challenges of kincare families. The Task Force, co-chaired by the Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services, a mental health and social service agency, and MFY Legal Services, Inc., a nonprofit law firm serving the civil legal needs of low-income people, addresses the need for cross-systems exchange and provides a channel through which established and newly developing kincare programs benefit from each other's experiences.

The Task Force's 39 member agencies/organizations represent a cross-section of providers, researchers and consumers from the aging, child guidance, mental health, child welfare and legal fields. The Kincare Task Force is a collaborative partnership that promotes cross-fertilization of information and ideas, program development, public policy analysis and coalition building. Gaps in service are identified and brought to the attention of the appropriate agencies.

The Task Force's objectives are:

- To educate and facilitate cross-systems communication
- To identify gaps in service and policy related to kincare families
- To disseminate findings and models of service
- To create an intergenerational network of kincare service providers

LIFT provides family law information and support to unrepresented litigants, including caregivers, so that they can successfully self-advocate in the New York Family Courts. LIFT operates a family law telephone and email hotlines, as well as education and information sites located inside the Brooklyn, Bronx, Manhattan, and Queens Family Courts, and a Family Legal Center which offers in-depth support, including one-on-one meetings, individualized legal information, help preparing court documents, court accompaniment, and short-term counseling and referrals to social services to unrepresented grandparents and parents with child support, custody, or visitation issues. LIFT also offers biweekly support groups for kinship caregivers and fathers. LIFT publishes 36 multi-lingual, easy-to-read Legal Resource Guides on a range of family law topics, available on its website, at LIFT's court-based education and information sites, and at the Family Legal Center located in lower Manhattan.
