



What You Need to Know About Unemployment Insurance Benefits and the CARES Act During COVID-19 Outbreak

WHAT IS THE CARES ACT?

The CARES Act is the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act which was signed into law March 27, 2020.

WHAT DOES THE CARES ACT DO?

The Act provides enhanced Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits and Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) for New Yorkers. Individuals who have been traditionally ineligible for UI benefits (e.g., independent contractors, self-employed workers, etc.) may now be eligible for this benefit under PUA.

HOW DO I APPLY?
