Mobilization for Justice (formerly MFY Legal Services), a non-profit legal services organization that provides a wide range of free civil legal services to low-income New Yorkers, is seeking a staff attorney to join its Warren Sinsheimer Children's Rights Program, which provides advice and representation to parents of students with disabilities seeking appropriate special education services and school placements from the New York City Department of Education. The staff attorney will provide direct representation of parents at Individualized Education Program (IEP) meetings, administrative due process hearings, and in appeals before the New York State Review Officer and in federal court.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Conducting client intake on telephone, in the community, and/or in hospital or clinic settings;
- Research and writing;
- Representation of parents at IEP meetings;
- Representation of parents at administrative hearings, including drafting complaints, negotiating settlements, preparing and presenting witness testimony, conducting cross-examination, engaging in motion practice, and filing briefs;
- Representation of parents in administrative and court appeals;
- Identifying issues for impact or class-action litigation and policy initiatives;
- Participating in coalition-building and advocating for systemic reform in the delivery of appropriate special education services to students with disabilities;
- Conducting community outreach and presenting trainings; and
- Inputting and maintaining records in MFJ's case management system.

Requirements:

- J.D. and admission to the New York State Bar;
- At least two years of experience in special education litigation;
- Demonstrated interest in disability rights and problems affecting students with disabilities;
- Excellent research and writing skills;
- Demonstrated ability to work under pressure and balance multiple, competing deadlines; and
- Fluency in Spanish.

Preferred:

• Experience with school discipline hearings.
